The role of the library media specialist (LMS) is four-fold. **As a teacher** the LMS teaches students to use information for critical thinking and problem solving using the *Information Literacy Standards* for Student Learning

As an instructional partner, the LMS works closely with individual teachers in the critical area of designing authentic learning tasks and assessments and integrating the information and communication abilities required to meet subject matter standards.

As an information specialist, the LMS offers guidance with the acquisition and evaluation of information resources in all formats. Teachers, administrators, students and others benefit from the strategies administered by the library media specialist.

As a program administrator, the LMS guides and directs all the activities related to the library media program. Proficient in the management of staff, budgets, equipment, and facilities, the library media specialist plans, executes, and evaluates the program to ensure its quality and relevance in the learning community.

The library media center (LMC) at Marshall Middle school directly services the students, teachers and parents attending Marshall grades 6-8. The LMC is

open from 7:45 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. Monday through Friday.

Students may check out materials (fiction, non-fiction, graphic novels, paperbacks, magazines, and audio books) for two weeks at a time. A maximum of three items may be checked out at any one time.

Library cards are issued to every student each school year around mid October. Once the cards are issued, students are required to have them for checking out materials.
