

- Wrote a **poem** when his high school football team won a big game
- **Poem published** 2 days later in the local newspaper

- 1963 graduate of Gettysburg College
- earned an MA from Johns Hopkins University in 1964
- 1966 to 1972 he served in the United States Navy Reserve.
- 1977 he married his wife Eileen
- Started out writing for adults -- never published
- Writing direction changed when one of his **six** children ate the **fried chicken** he was saving for the next day
- Chicken event lead to first book published "**Space Station Seventh Grade**"


But the thing Maniac Magee is best known for is what he did for the kids from the East Side and those from the West Side.



In fact they react by doing a little bit of both.

First **they embrace her uniqueness** by imitating her, and then, just as quickly, they turn on her for being unusual. Despite her status as outcast, Leo and Stargirl become a couple, and he experiences what it's like to be shunned. In hopes of gaining acceptance Leo encourages her to become normal. Together both Leo and Stargirl learn a lesson about conforming to the will of the group versus being yourself.




"My real name is John. John Coogan. But **everybody calls me Crash, even my parents...**"

- Before starting school, played game of pretending his **clothes were on fire** and rolled down hills to put them out
- In first grade, placed in the "**Blue Bird**" group
- Unaware it was for slow readers
- **6th grade** realized he could be a writer after reading his sister's **diary**
- \$10,000 for boat trip **from Virgin Islands to New York**
- Sentenced to **6 years** in prison summer of 1971
- Book based on his prison experience called **Hole in My Life**
- Earn Bachelor of Fine Arts & Master of Arts degree from **Emerson College**
- Married with one child, **Mabel Grace**


- **Jack on the Tracks** won the Dorothy Canfield Fisher award.
- **Dorothy Canfield Fisher award** is an award that the kids decide who gets the award for the best and most exiting book. Decided on by **Vermont** school children.
- **Joey Pigza Loses Control** won a **Newbery Honor** award in 2001

Today he is teaching children's book writing at Vermont College. Jack continued writing Children's books even after he completed college.




Joey Pigza Swallowed the Key




Joey Pigza Loses Control


What Would Joey Do?

"Just tell them what they want to hear," Dad says.


"Just tell the truth," Mom cautions.




**Jack on the Tracks:
